Mark Herrmann grew up in Carmel, Indiana, where he was an outstanding high school athlete.

Mark played quarterback on the Greyhounds football team and led the Carmel basketball team to a State Championship in 1977. Herrmann was awarded the Arthur L. Trester Award for his mental attitude, leadership, scholarship and basketball talents.

Herrmann landed in the national spotlight as an All-American quarterback at Purdue University. In 1980 he was selected as the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player, and he finished fourth in voting for the Heisman Trophy.

Herrmann was drafted by the Denver Broncos in 1981. He later played with the San Diego Chargers, Los Angeles Rams and Indianapolis Colts. He retired from the NFL in 1992.

Mark resides in Indianapolis where he is Associate Director of Educational Programs for the NCAA.
